TITANIC SURVIVORS ARE BURIED AT WHITE HAVEN

On the morning of April 10th, 1912, the Titanic set sail on its maiden voyage. Leaving from Southampton, England and headed for New York City, NY. Mr. Edward Beane and Mrs. Ethel Beane boarded the ship with ticket number 2908, ready to enjoy their honeymoon. Little did they know that their romantic wedding celebration was headed for an uncertain fate.

Mr. Edward Beane was born in 1879 in Norfolk, England. He spent a short time in NY as a bricklayer before returning to England. Mrs. Ethel Beane was born in 1889 in Norfolk, England. She worked as a dressmaker and a furrier. Three days before the Titanic set sail Mr. & Mrs. Beane were married and made plans to settle in New York City where Edward had spent some time. They boarded the ship as second-class passengers.

At 11:40 PM the Titanic struck an iceberg and began to sink. Being second-class passengers only Mrs. Beane was allowed on a lifeboat. Mr. Beane claimed, in later years, that he jumped overboard, after his wife's boat was lowered into the water, and swam to her. He was one of very few second-class males that survived the wreck. They were both rescued by a boat named The Carpathia and brought to New York City. The couple settled in Rochester and lived on Michigan Street. They had two children and did not speak much about their trip on the Titanic.

Edward passed in 1948 at the age of 68 and was buried at White Haven. Ethel died in 1983 at the age of 93 and was placed next to her husband.
