Flower and Wreath Reminders

<u>Wednesday, November 5th is the LAST day for flower arrangements</u> on graves. Starting on Nov. 5th at 8:00 am, we will remove any remaining flowers. We will also be turning off all water in the Park.

<u>Tuesday, November 11th is Veterans Day.</u> You may place an American flag on the grave of a veteran on Veterans Day. Please place the flag directly in the ground rather than using the vase cup.

<u>Saturday, November 15th is the FIRST day that wreaths</u> are permitted on the grounds. We need the time between the 6th and the 14th of November to clear our grounds of all decorations and leaves before the snow starts to fall.

Goats, Not Ghosts!

White Haven Memorial Park partnered with Kaizen Ridge Farms for an eco-friendly fall clean-up. This fall, White Haven Memorial Park embraced an eco-friendly twist on traditional landscape maintenance. In partnership with Kaizen Ridge Farms, we welcomed a team of unexpected but highly effective groundskeepers: GOATS!

As part of our ongoing commitment to sustainability and in keeping with our status as a Certified Audubon Sanctuary, these goats helped manage seasonal brush cleanup across the Park. Their mission was to munch their way through invasive species like poison ivy, offering a natural, chemical-free solution for ground cover removal.

"We are always looking for the best options to care for our wildlife and natural spaces," says JudieLynn Nassar McAvinney, President and CEO of White Haven Memorial Park. "We were thrilled to be collaborating with Kaizen Ridge Farms to bring in another sustainable method for Park maintenance."

The goats arrived on Wednesday, September 17th, and were here for the day. Many visitors came to see them in action as they roamed, grazed, and did their part to keep the Park healthy and beautiful.









New Mausoleums

If you've had the opportunity to visit White Haven recently, you've likely noticed the progress we're making on the construction of our two new mausoleums. This marks the beginning of the Edgewood Garden Mausoleum Complex—a visionary project that will unfold over the next 25 years.

Once complete, the complex will feature a total of 10-12 beautifully designed buildings, surrounding a serene and thoughtfully landscaped garden park. This space will include peaceful water features, a meditative labyrinth, a columbarium, an ossuary, and quiet areas to sit, reflect, and remember.

The mausoleums will offer spaces for both full-body and cremated burials. For families who prefer an indoor setting, a portion of the mausoleums will be enclosed in glass, allowing loved ones to be interred within a protected and light-filled environment.

Throughout the entire project, we remain committed to honoring and protecting our natural resources, ensuring they are preserved and celebrated for generations to come.
